Successful 2020 MHSTeCA Season Message, from 3rd V.P. Ron Landfair &

The Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association (MHSTeCA) held it's Fall Board of Directors Meeting virtually on October 31.

A number of items were discussed including the format that was used for boys tennis this past fall, the selection of the All-State Team and Mr. Tennis and the winners of the Coach of the Year in each division.

This past fall, Dan Hutcheson spent countless hours putting together a format that would provide tennis players a season this fall.

Through his tireless efforts the boys were able to compete in the postseason as well.

The top four teams in each district were seeded this year, instead of the typical individual flights.

Then each district was divided up into two tournaments so only four teams were at each tournament site.

The top seed was invited to be the host.

The winner from each half of the district was then invited to compete at the MHSAA State Tournament.

Sixteen teams qualified in each division for the state tournament. All teams were seeded and the draw was set up accordingly.

If a score was tied 4-4 after all flights were played, there was a series of tiebreak guidelines, with the first being the number of sets won, followed by the number of games won, and so on. This format made for a very exciting atmosphere!

The MHSAA wanted to see who the top singles player in each division was, as well.

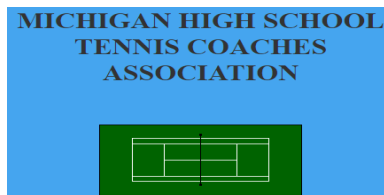
So the after the team state tournament, they hosted the top eight #1 singles players in each division in a singles state tournament.

A committee was set up to look at the top players' records and sent out invitations to those qualifiers.

The MHSTeCA is very thankful to the MHSAA and Dan Hutcheson's efforts to provide the very best possible opportunities for the boys this fall during such uncertain times.

The Board of Directors also selected the Singles All-State team and Doubles All-State teams in each division.

Along with that, each division chose a



senior #1 singles player as their nominee for Mr. Tennis; from this group, an overall Mr. Tennis was chosen.

This year's overall recipient of the Bob Wood Mr. Tennis Award goes to Division 4 player William Cooksey of University Liggett.

Also at the October 31 meeting, the board selected the Coach of the Year for each division.

* Additionally, one boy and one girl from each of the four classifications of schools...(A,B,C,D) will be selected.

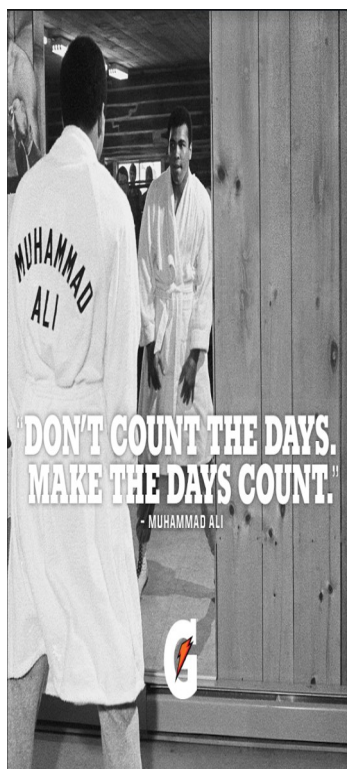
*Awards will be presented at

TOUCHLESS HYDRATION

Follow these best practices in situations that call for a contact-free approach to athlete hydration, to help prevent the spread of germs among your athletes.



HYDRATION BEST PRACTICES

- **Develop** a protocol to have your athletes drink at scheduled intervals to optimize hydration breaks in the training room/weight room
- **Educate** your athletes on mask hygiene and proper use
- **Assign** a designated staff member to administer fluid
- **Assemble** a hydration table for squeeze bottles and electrolytes

SQUEEZE BOTTLES/CUP DISTRIBUTION

NOTE: If using cups, plan ahead to ensure you have enough to meet individual needs.

- **Label** squeeze bottles with the names of your athletes
- **Provide** wide mouth squeeze bottles whenever possible
- **Consider** providing or asking athletes to bring (two) reusable bottles per athlete—practice/competition and one extra for personal use
- **Determine** a squeeze bottle size that will work best for your athletes
- **Dispose** of used cups in a biohazard bag

ELECTROLYTE PROVISION

- **Equip** hydration table with electrolyte packets
- **Encourage** athletes to grab electrolyte packets and add to their bottle as needed
- **Consider** having additional premixed squeeze bottles for high-risk athletes
- **Provide** a trash bag for discarded packets



HYDRATION TESTING CHECKLIST

- ☐ Biohazard Bag
- ☐ Disposable Urine Cup
- ☐ Gloves
- ☐ Masks
- ☐ Refractometer
- ☐ Sanitizer
- ☐ Wipes

NOTE: Refractometers need to be cleaned after each use with a disinfectant wipe and the surface should be cleaned with distilled water between each test.

SANITIZATION CONSIDERATIONS

- Ensure reusable bottles are sanitized every day
- Remember to rinse coolers an additional time before use

NOTE: Utilizing hydrogen peroxide sanitizer can help prevent the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19.

- To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport. This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year. For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.
