QUESTION-What would I do differently if I had a chance to start my career over?

 I would be more aware of my players' needs as they go through a typical high school season.

The teenage years are very tough for a variety of reasons. They have so much more going

on in their lives besides sports.

They are ruled by their emotions.

A coach must be more observant of a player's behavior. 2.

I would be more understanding when individual players or teams struggle. Basketball is an extremely hard game to play.

Players and teams will go through ups and downs during the season.

Coaches must understand this and change their approach if the player/team doesn't come out of their down cycles. 3. I would be more openminded in my approach to coaching the game.

When I was a young coach, I played only man defense and ran a ball controlled offense.

This served us well if we were not real talented, but it hurt our more talented teams.

I learned to give up some control.

4. I would seek more advice in learning how to coach a game.

I learned over a period of years that I could learn more about coaching and the game itself, if I took the time to talk to others. I observed practice structure techniques from a choir teacher and a band director. I talked to former players, current players, older coaches, young coaches, administrators, and parents.

These people helped me become better at what I do.

5. I would give players and assistant coaches more time off during the season.

The season is long and it wears people out.

I eventually convinced myself that is was important to give my players and coaches time to recharge.

A practice that lasts an hour and a half that contains

effort and quality is much better for players than a three hour practice where everyone ends up watching the clock.

When you can take selected days off in the latter part of the season, it is beneficial to everyone in your program.

NEW PROCEDURE FOR CAMP INSURANCE

As a member benefit of your state coaches association, all members in good standing have a \$1,000,000 per occurrence General Liability policy limit that provides coverage for their coaching activities. In order to protect the General Liability policy from potential claims, the insurance company has mandated that all coaches must obtain signed waivers and provide Participant/Accident insurance for their participants.

In order to obtain a certificate of insurance showing proof of insurance or naming an additional insured, the following must be in place:

- Participant/Accident Insurance: You must have Participant/Accident coverage in place for all participants attending sports camps.

October Newsletter from the

Greetings NHSACA board members and directors! Hopefully everyone is navigating our unique time in history as well as possible and all are staying healthy. Again, I want to wish all of you a happy National Coaches Day this past October 6. It's not a widely known day, but hopefully you were reminded in some way how valued and important you are.

Not an extremely full plate of information this month since much of the normal October information relates to the Coach of the Year rosters, which is already done with the postponement of the convention last summer. We have not had sponsors for specific sports in the recent past, but with sport chairs not scoring rubrics this year, some of that time could be spent securing a sponsor for your sport. Terms are negotiable, but if we can find some interest, we can go from there! Lastly, please keep active on our goal of working outside of the convention with our committee work.

With the postponement of the convention, what we would normally be doing and discussing in the fall has already been done. We have covered our strange times, importance of coaching, and where we should head as an organization in previous newsletters. Since I'm a social studies teacher, I thought I could give some history of coaching, but that didn't get me very far. Then, I thought I could discuss some of the great coaches in history. As I was looking into that, I found some stories about these famous coaches I could share and then......

it hit me. I absolutely love listening to coaches, young and veteran, tell coaching stories. They make me laugh, inspire me, keep things in perspective, and keep me going.

So, this newsletter will be "interactive". Unprecedented times calls for unprecedented action. If you are willing, "reply all" to this email and share a coaching story. It can be about someone that coached you or from your coaching days. I will share a few stories, and I look forward to hearing from you!

I was at my first NHSACA convention in Louisville, and a board member introduced himself to me and struck up a conversation. He could not have been any nicer in making me feel welcomed. He made an off the cuff comment about the McDonald's All American game. I did a mental double take and thought who is this guy? After our conversation, I Googled his name and let out gasp. Turns out, this down to earth gentleman was a LEGEND and none other than Ed Kershner. I felt honored that someone that accomplished went out of his way to talk to little old me.

In baseball my senior year, I was benched. I had never been benched (not that I was all that great). I didn't know how to react and really just sat there. I was angry, embarrassed, and hurt. After the game my coach told me why he took me out and what he saw from me after I was taken out. He was honest and taught me valuable lessons on teamwork

and being a leader that I use today in making those same types of decisions.

Early in my track career we had three main throwers. One was a freshman with a lot of talent and would later be a state champion discus thrower. He threw shot and discus. We had a senior who threw just discus and was well below average. He worked hard and it was really important to him. Then, we had a junior that had not been out before and was new to throwing. We asked him to just focus only on the shot. Partly because that's where his interest was and partly because the ONLY thing the senior could do was throw discus. He had been out all 4 years and been loyal to the program and we respected that.

Towards the end of the season, junior started to experiment with the discus. The week of our last meet, my assistant coach told me the junior was looking "really good" in the discus and might be better than the senior. We happened to have been in the worst discus district I have ever seen (top 2 would go to state). I tossed out a number and asked if he thought he could throw it far. His response was absolutely. I had not entertained the idea of making a switch until then. We were not going to win districts, and I wasn't going to destroy a seniors last athletic event on "might", but if this junior had a chance to go to state even if unlikely...... well, that changed things.

I felt I owed the senior a shot to keep the spot, but also the junior still needed to take it. At our last meet, I told them the junior would throw JV and the senior varsity. Whoever threw further would throw at districts. Throwing into a stiff wind, the junior threw one foot further. The senior was devastated, and I felt horrible. On the way to the meet, I got a text from the senior's parents saying they wanted a meeting with the principal on Monday. I was ready to vomit. At that moment coaching was NOT fun in any way. But as the junior stepped into the ring for his first varsity throw, which happened to be the first throw of the meet, and he absolutely uncorked a monster throw...... coaching WAS fun.

He and our freshman both qualified for state, and the junior would return the next year and not only qualify for state but place at state in both the shot and discus. I also got a text Monday morning that our meeting with the principal had been canceled and not rescheduled. One of the best feelings I have had as a coach wrapped in one of the worst. That's the tightrope coaches balance all the time.
