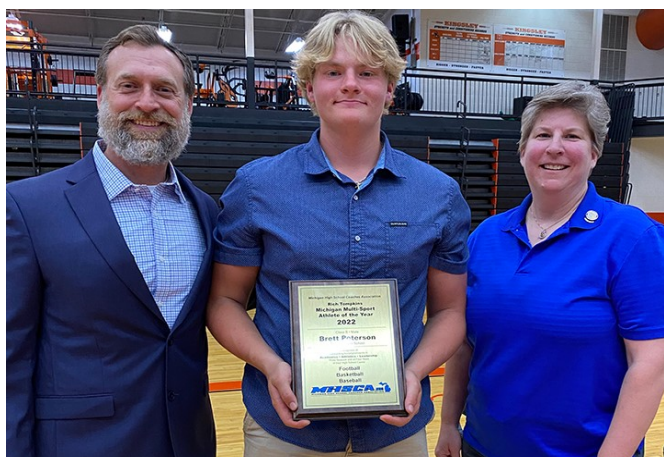

MHSCA COACHING RECOGNITION

The candidate must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship throughout his/her coaching career.

*The AD or principal's signature confirms this.

Ten (10) years of coaching outside of Michigan may be applied to the application. Coaching at any level may be applied as long as it is a school sponsored interscholastic sport.

To receive a general coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of years.

To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or

season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Up to three (3) years may be included for active duty military service which delayed or interrupted an applicant's coaching career.

Awards for 30 years and more (plaque) will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque.

The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

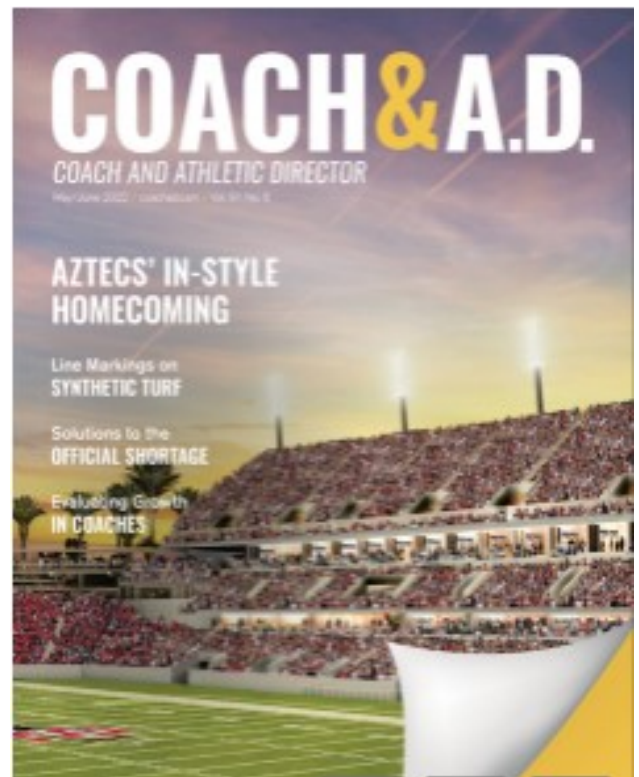

A Memorial Tribute



Coach John Dean, was a legendary coach known for bringing tough competition to the football field every time. Passed away January 2022 His coaching accolades began at Detroit Northern High school where he was Athletic Director and Head Football Coach for forty years. John coached swimming, baseball, basketball and football at Northern. He lead Northern to win the City championship in 1978 and numerous runner ups subsequently. John Dean served as Michigan High School Football Coaches Association President for two terms and Varsity Club president. He was a member of the Sunday Headmen's Golf Club for over thirty years.

He was inducted into the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1995 and John was inducted in to the Greater Knox-



On February 16, 2022, Charles "Coach" Robert Zeiter died peacefully in Mt. Pleasant, Michigan. He was 84 years old.

Charlie was born on September 22, 1937 in Cleveland, Ohio. As a young child, he helped his dad at Zeiter Speedway and at the age of 12, moved to Clare, Michigan and helped raise cows on their dairy farm. He graduated from Clare High School and Central Michigan University where he graduated with a teaching degree. He went on to become a math teacher at Farwell Middle School and a ski coach for 48 years with Farwell, Clare and Mt. Pleasant High Schools. "Coach's" passion was skiing, and he was successful in sharing that passion with anyone he encountered. He was inducted into the Michigan High School Ski Coaches Hall of Fame and the Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame and his legacy will live on.



Coach Bod Dozier, a member of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association's Hall of Fame, was a graduate of Detroit Cass Tech, where he was an outstanding quarterback. Passed in April 2022. The 27 years of coaching: Detroit Central, & Detroit Mackenzie. Coach was named Public School League Coach of the Year. MHSFCA Regional Coach

Dozier was of the Coach of the year in 1989. In ducted into the Olivet College Hall of Fame on this 5th day of September, 2003.
