The National High School Athletic Coaches Association the professional organization of school coaches and athletic directors, (NHSACA) will induct Coach Lober & Coach Seger along with member states of the NHSACA . The award will be presented July 25th as part of the NHSACA annual conference which takes place July 24-27 at the NHSACA Annual Conference in which over 00 coaches an athletic directors will participate





John Lober, a coaching legend at Traverse City Central High School, Lober oversaw the boys track and field team at Central for 52 years, from 1977 until his retirement in 2021, also serving as head cross country coach for 27 of those years (1989-2016).

In 2015, NHSACA named him National Track Coach of the Year, and he's long been a member of numerous noted halls of fame, including for the Michigan High School Coaches Association and for Traverse City Central High School.

This particular induction puts Lober in even more rarified air, making him just the third Traverse City

Central coach to make the NHSACA Hall of Fame.



Larry Seger coached the men's varsity tennis team from 1969-2008 for a total of 40 seasons at Thornapple Kellogg Schools.

His team earning eight conference titles, two regional titles, and had two All-State singles players.

He also coached the women's varsity tennis team from 1974-2020 for a total of 46 seasons earning 14 conference titles, three regional titles and had four All-State singles players.



His combined dual season record is 741-345 - third best of all time. Seger also has 52 tournament wins and 10 undefeated teams (dual seasons) to his credit.

At the State Tournament his teams had 13 top 15 finishes, seven top

10 finishes and three

top 5 finish-

es.

A dedicate ed and supportive coach, Larry wanted his athletes to "be the best they could, and by emphasizing this over winning, the wins and years just kept coming!"



Thomas M. LaFramboise was born May 3, 1943. He loved all sports and after a stellar high school career, graduating from Lincoln Park High School in 1961, he attended the University of Louisville as a scholar athlete where he excelled at both football and baseball. While playing football at Louisville for the

years 1962-1964 he had 239 completed passes, 2755 yards and a QB rating of 96.6.

He was drafted in the NFL as a Quarterback for the Chicago Bears in 1964.

He was also being recruited by the Dallas Cowboys and received a letter of intent. After a short NFL career, he decided his best path was to be an educator.

He was a teacher and a football coach at Ypsilanti Lincoln Consolidated and Grosse lle High School.

He coached football for over 34 years, had 1 Conference Championship, was named Regional Coach of the Year by the Ypsilanti Press, News Herald Coach of the year 1991, MHSFBCA Hall of Fame in 1994, two sport inductee to the University of Louisville Hall of Fame 2000, and Lincoln Park Sports Hall of Fame 2002.

Tom loved and excelled at golf. He had two hole in ones, won the Club Championship at West Shore Golf and Country Club in 1993 and the Senior Club Championship in 1994He passed away peacefully on January 25, 2023.

The family will host a celebration of life service on April 17, 2023, at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Trenton, Michigan, with visitation at 9:30 a.m. followed by Mass of Christian Burial at 10 a.m.

NEW PROCEDURE FOR CAMP INSURANCE

As a member benefit of your state coaches association, all members in good standing have a \$1,000,000 per occurrence General Liability policy limit that provides coverage for their coaching activities. In order to protect the General Liability policy from potential claims, the insurance company has mandated that all coaches must obtain signed waivers and provide Participant/Accident insurance for their participants.

Coaching Recognition

The candidate must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship throughout his/her coaching career.

*The AD or principal's signature confirms this.

Ten (10) years of coaching outside of Michigan may be applied to the application. Coaching at any level may be applied as long as it is a school sponsored interscholastic sport.

To receive a general coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of years.

To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both

boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Up to three (3) years may be included for active duty military service which delayed or interrupted an applicant's coaching career.

Awards for 30 years and more (plaque) will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque.

The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

What is MITCA?

What is MITCA?

The Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association (MITCA)

is a coaching organization with a membership of approximately

twelve hundred, track and field and cross country coaches.

Founded in 1959, MITCA operates under a set of by-laws and is

dedicated to the education and recognition of the athlete and coach.

This is achieved through several programs:

EDUCATION

Cross Country Clinic – annually held during the second weekend of November, this clinic typically draws four hundred cross country coaches to hear noted clinicians speak on a variety of topics.

Track and Field Clinic – annually held in February, this clinic typically draws up to nine hundred track and field coaches to hear noted clinicians speak on a variety of topics.

MITCA Newsletter – published quarterly includes meet results and articles of interest covering news, training tips, etc.

Team Michigan – in the fall, a group of ten senior boys and ten senior girls qualify to run and are sponsored by MITCA in the Mid-East Meet of Champions held in Ohio, competing against teams from several surrounding states. In the spring, a track team of senior boys and girls are sponsored by MITCA to compete in the Mid-West Meet of Champions.

Free Membership – in the Michigan High School Coaches Association, including supplemental liability insurance.

RECOGNITION

All-State – The top thirty runners in each boys and girls division race in cross country and the top eight finishers in each event in track and field are awarded a MITCA All- State Certificates

Academic All-State – Top finishers in cross country and track and field, in each division, meeting a minimum grade point average receive a certificate honoring their athletic and academic accomplishments.

Coach of the Year – four boys' team coaches and four girls' team coaches from each of four divisions are nominated for Coach of the Year honors. A membership vote selects the COY (XC coaches must be members by Oct.1; TF coaches by May 1).

Assistant Coach of the Year and Middle School Coach of the Year – awarded to those nominated by their head coach.

15/25 Year Recognition – as coaches reach these career benchmarks, they are recognized at the cross country and track & field clinics, each receiving a certificate.

Patsy Arpeno Scholarship – two five hundred dollar scholarships are awarded via random draw to children of MITCA members in college.

"Mr./Ms. Track and Field" and "Mr./Ms. Cross Country" Awards

Track & Field and Cross Country "Dream Teams"

Hall of Fame – MITCA selects up to four coaches per year to be inducted into the MITCA Hall of Fame.

Additionally, each year a cross country and a track and field coach are recognized for life time achievement via the Ambrose and Sweeney awards respectively.

POLITICAL

MITCA works to develop new ideas, and the rules necessary to create the best athletic experience for those boys and girls who participate in the sports of cross country and track and field.

Because MITCA is not the governing organization for high school athletics, these ideas and rule suggestions are taken to the MHSAA for consideration. The flow-chart below diagrams this process.

- To receive <u>specific</u> certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of <u>years</u> in that sport. This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year. For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.
