NHSACA Coaches of the Year Delgates Heading to Lincoln, Nebraska

The 2023 National High School Athletic Coaches Association conference will have 4 MHSCA State Coach of the Year finalist attending the 2023 convention as one of eight finalist in their sport to see who will be named National Coach of the Year from the National High School Athletic Coaches Association.

Heading to the Cornhusker State:

Grant Fanning of Chelsea as a Assistant boys coach of they year nominee.



Fanning has been defensive coordinator at Chelsea for 25-years. Since arriving in Chelsea in 1997, the team has not allowed more than 265 points in a season and his defenses have allowed an average of less than 20 points in 17 seasons, including the past seven. His legacy was cemented as he helped lead Chelsea to the Division 4 state championship. Grant has also coached at Saline 1991-1993, Dexter 1995-1996, Chelsea 1997-2022

Next up is Football Coach Tyrone Spencer from Detroit Martin Luther King.

Spencer concluded his 13th year coaching high school football and 7th season overall as a head coach





at King, compiling a 75-17 (81.5%) record. As head coach, Spencer has won 4 MHSAA State Championships—a Division 2 State Championship in 2016 and Division 3 State Championships in 2018, 2021 and 2022. He also led the Crusaders to a state runner up appearance in 2019, a state semi -finals appearance in 2017 and a regional finals appearance in 2020. Overall, Spencer has a 30-3 (90.9%) playoff record. Spencer, a 2003 King graduate, spent 5 years as an assistant coach at King prior to taking over as head coach of the Crusaders, also winning a MHSAA Division 2 State Championship in 2015. Spencer, 36, has compiled a 65-14 record as King's head coach.

Stepping up next is Coach Jill Ever for the sport of Cross Country.



As the Kent City's girls' and boys' varsity cross country programs in 1993 She led Kent City's girls' cross-country team to a Lower Peninsula Division 3 Final runner-up finish in 2021, the program's second runner-up finish under her

leadership, and she's also guided Kent City's girls program to 15 league and seven Regional titles and nine total top-eight Finals finishes

Pewamo Westphalia Coach Scott Werner is the fourth MHSCA as a national finalist, Werner began coaching in 2001 and has led the Pewamo Westphalia Pirates to 3 team state championships, 4 team state runners-up, 9 team regional championships and 15 CMAC championships. Furthermore, 21 different teams have finished in 16th place or higher at state finals and 31 state champions and 64 all-state athletes have competed for him.

Michigan's NHSACA HOF Inductees



Coach Lober coached at Traverse City Central for 52 years, and still helps with the track and cross-country teams.

He posted a 367-36-3 dual-meet record, won 136 invitationals, produced 68 all-state athletes, won 21 conference championships, racked up 10 top-10 team finishes in the state finals and won a Class A state title in 1992. Seven of his athletes went on to All-American careers and five hold state records. He led the Trojans to 11 regional titles. He was the 1982 MITCA Coach of the Year and Michigan High School Coaches Association Track Coach of the Year, 1991 Michigan High School Coaches Association Track Coach of the Year, 1992 MITCA Coach of the Year and won Division 1 team state title, 1996 induction into Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame, 2001 USATF Pole Vault National High School Track Coach of the Year, 2006induction into the Michigan

Interscholastic Track Coaches Association Hall of Fame, 2008 induction into the Traverse City Central Hall of Fame, 2014 National Federation of High Schools National Track Coach of the Year and Michigan High School Coaches Association Track Coach of the Year and 2015 National High School Athletic Coaches Association National Track Coach of the Year.





Larry Seger coached tennis a total of fifty-two consecutive years at Thornapple Kellogg High School. He coached the men's varsity tennis team from 1969-2008 for a total of forty seasons earning eight Conference Titles, two Regional Titles, and had two All-State singles players. He also coached the women's varsity tennis team from 1974- 2020 for a total of forty-six seasons earning fourteen Conference Titles, three Regional Titles and had four All-State singles players. His combined dual season record is 741-345 – Third best of all time. Larry also has fifty-two tournament wins and ten undefeated teams (dual seasons) to his credit. At the State Tournament his teams had thirteen Top 15 finishes, seven Top 10 finishes and three Top 5 finishes. A dedicated and supportive coach, Larry wanted his athletes to "be the best they could, and by emphasizing this over winning, the wins and years just kept coming!" Because of his dedication to his student athletes Larry has received many honors during his career. He was named the Regional Coach of the Year multiple times for men's and women's tennis and was the Class B Girls Tennis Coach of the Year in 1986. He has also been inducted into the Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association Hall of Fame (1994) and the Thornapple Kellogg Hall of Fame (2016). Larry was also a member of the Michigan High School Tennis Association and served on the Board of Directors for multiple years in the 1980's. "Persistence is the determination to fight through the setbacks until you find success. Tough situations build strength. Believe in yourself." Coach Larry Seger

Now in 2023 during the National High School Athletic Coach Association convention these two Michigan High School Coach Association members will be inducted as part of the 50 states National High school Athletic Coach Association Hall of Fame class.



CAMP INSURANCE

Today, most Coaches are involved in some type of sports camp. Please note that our General Liability Program follows insured members while working at camps and/or conducting their own personal camp.

In addition, Participant/Accident Coverage is required for coaches and/or participants. Should an accident occur during a camp, clinic or event, this secondary coverage helps offset the loss suffered by families affected by such accidents.

NEW PROCEDURE FOR CAMP INSURANCE

As a member benefit of your state coaches association, all members in good standing have a \$1,000,000 per occurrence General Liability policy limit that provides coverage for their coaching activities. In order to protect the General Liability policy from potential claims, the insurance company has mandated that all coaches must obtain signed waivers and provide Participant/Accident insurance for their participants.

In order to obtain a certificate of insurance showing proof of insurance or naming an additional insured, the following must be in place:

- Waivers: Signed waivers showing indemnification language
- Participant/Accident Insurance: You must have Participant/Accident coverage in place for all participants attending sports camps.

MHSCA Membership Benefits

- Sport Association Voice: The MHSCA provides member sport associations another vehicle of communication with the MHSAA. Each year the MHSCA makes a presentation to the MHSAA Representative Council representing issues of our association members.
- Coaching Longevity Awards: Beginning with 10 years of coaching and ascending every 5 years, coaches receive recognition for their years of coaching (10-25 years earn cellicates, 30-45 years receive plaques, and at 50 years a coach will receive a special crystal recognition).
- MHSCA Coach of the Year Recognition Each year one coach from your association is chosen by your association to be recognized at the MHSCA State Coach of the Year for your sport.
- coaches from the state are selected for induction into the MHSCA Hall of Fame. The Hall is an actual physical entity that is located not he state of the the state of the the state of the campus of Central Michigan University within the Student Activity Center at the entrance of the old Rose Arena. In addition to meeting the established criteria the individual's sport association must be a member association within the MHSCA.
- MHSCA Jack Johnson Distinguished Service Award: One person per year (teacher, coach, administrator, other) nominated by a member sport association will be honored at the September Hall of Fame banquet for outstanding service to high school sports in Michigan.
- NOCAD Insurance: "As a membership benefit, coverage is provided by the Commercial General Liability Policy issued to the National Cognization of Coaches Association Directors (NOCAD). This policy provides \$1,000,000 (\$2,000,000 aggregate) per member liability coverage to only members of the Michigan High School Coaches Association that pay for the additional coverage through MHSCA member sport associations. "New members taking the NOCAD insurance liability coverage are covered on the first date that they pay their membership due to their sport association through August 1. Members whose sport association paid their for their insurance coverage the previous year are covered August 1—August 1 if they become members of their sport association and their sport association pays their insurance premium. For \$6.00 per coach per year this coverage is hard to to match. Members find more detailed information on the missos and years the "Coaches Corner" drop down link titled "Insurance."
- Rich Tompkins Multi-Sport Award: This award recognizes athletes that have participated in at least 3 MHSAA sports per year for the 4 years of high school. All nominees receive a high quality certificate. One boy and one girl from each of the four classes of schools (A, B, C, D) will receive a plaque and a scholarship (if eligible) as the MHSCA Rich Tompkins State Multi-Sport Athlete of the Year.
- Gatorade Supplies: Member sport associations receive Gatorade give-away supplies to use at their clinics or all-star games.

- National Federation of High Schools Coach of the Year Recognition: Each year one coach from your association is nominated by your sport association through the MHSCA to be considered for state and national level recognition.
- As a member of the MHSCA you also receiv membership into the National High Schoi Athletic Coaches Association (NHSACA) wit membership benefits available.
- NHSACA Coach of the Year Recognition: Each year one coach from your sport association can be nominated through the MHSCA for consideration for regional and national recognitions.
- NHSACA Hall of Fame: The MHSCA is allowed to select two coaches each year for induction into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
- NHSACA Kathy Holloway Women in Sports Leadership Award: Presented annually to a female that has promoted female athletics by coaching, serving, supporting, and/or leading high school athletic programs. The nomination process runs through the MHSCA.
- NHSACA Distinguished Service Award: The MHSCA has the opportunity to have one of their members receive this award every 4th
